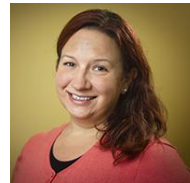

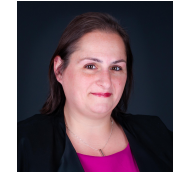

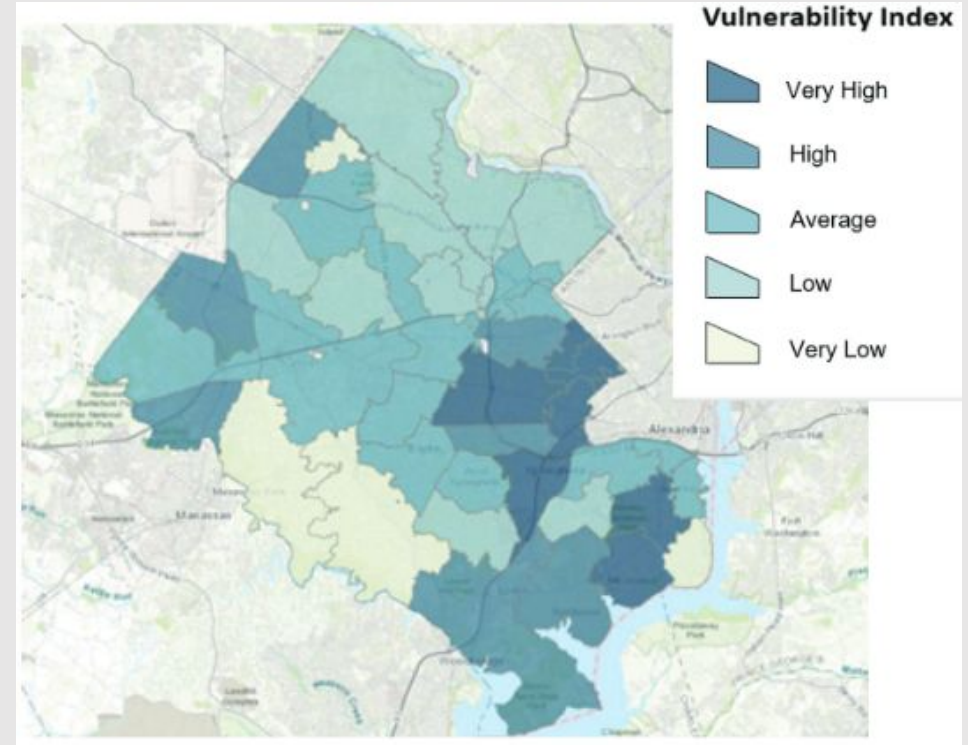


What's the problem?

- Fairfax County has a population of 1.2 million people
- Substantial variations in need across Fairfax County
- According to the Capital Area Food Bank's 2022 Hunger Report, the prevalence of food insecurity among Fairfax County households with children is 41%

According to the USDA, “food insecurity means that households were, at times, unable to acquire adequate food for one or more household members because they had insufficient money and other resources for food.”



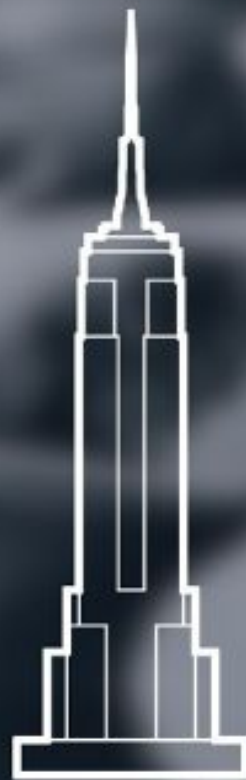
